Launch of an Important Oral History Collection

'Voices of the Troubles – An Oral History of 30 Years of Conflict' is a unique project funded by the Special EU Programmes Body Peace IV fund, with an objective to build positive relations with people from different backgrounds and communities, and to support peace and reconciliation. It was launched at The Hotel Kilmore, Cavan on Friday October 19.

From 2017 to early 2018, 'Irish Life and Lore', supported by Cavan Co. Library and by the EU's Peace IV Programme, interviewed over 100 people from all persuasions living in the border area of Cavan and Fermanagh to ascertain how 'The Troubles' from 1968 to 1998 affected their lives.

All interviews were handled in a sensitive manner allowing participants the opportunity to discuss their feelings and emotions freely, in many instances for the first time. One person interviewed said that 'Many people have spoken on our behalf, now we can speak for ourselves'.

The finished interviews will create an audio archive for Cavan County Council chronicling the lives of a border community during the turbulent years and will allow the public gain a direct understanding of the living conditions endured by an embattled border community from both the Nationalist and the Unionist perspective.
