Tote Bags and Tapestry - Edel Kelly		
10:00 am -12:00 noon	<p>We will explore the pebble relief printing technique on cotton canvas tote bags, all pre-made using sustainably sourced dead-stock fabrics.</p> <p>Participants will use prepared card templates to plan the layout of their stone designs before applying fabric paints directly onto the bags using rollers and paint-brushes. The workshop helps children experiment with shape, colour and composition using stones and pebbles from our natural environment.</p> <p>The print designs will feature the iconic standing stones known as Fionn McCool's five fingers. We will play around with form and colour to depict these famous structures.</p> <p>The primary objective of this workshop is to instill an understanding of the endless possibilities of fabric reuse and recycling and introduce young people to design techniques which elevate up-cycled products .</p>	8-12 year olds
1:00 - 3:30 pm	<p>CREATING TEXTILE ART PIECES USING RECYCLED MATERIALS</p> <p>We'll use the captivating myths of Cuilcagh Lakelands Geopark as inspiration to make abstract textile wall-hangings featuring the legendary Lugh, his dog, and his boat.</p> <p>Participants will arrange pre-cut fabric pieces in different colours to create their designs. We will explore basic appliqué techniques and participants can sew their pieces, using embroidery hoops. We will explore colour, form and texture through cutting, gluing, and appliqué.</p> <p>We'll use pre-prepared branches with hanging ropes to display the finished artworks. It's a hands-on experience where they'll learn about local myths and textile crafting while reusing materials creatively. 2.30-4:00 pm	<p>The giant Lugh in Irish folklore was the possessor and inventor of all the arts and was a great King and leader. At the 2nd battle of Moytura, Lugh slayed his grandfather Balor. Balor had lifted his eye with the intention of poisoning all it would behold. Lugh slew his grandfather with a slingshot that he aimed into his 'Evil Eye'. Lugh became the new King of the Tuatha De Danann.</p> <p>King Lugh Head-dress and sword- using a mix of materials including recycled and found natural materials the children will create a headdress fit for king and a small, bejewelled sword (from card). The children will be encouraged to take part in a short procession to display their work.</p> <p>Balor's Evil Eye- using a mix of materials the children will create Balors' evil eye! Collage is a creative and sustainable activity as it teaches children about recycling and reusing materials in a creative way.
