

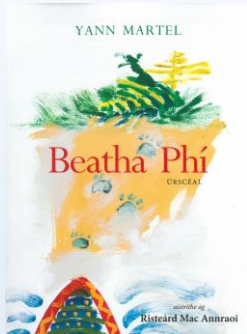

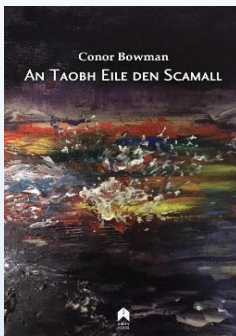

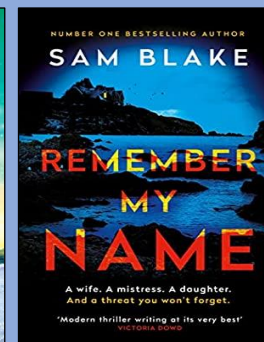
The Weekend Away - Sarah Alderson

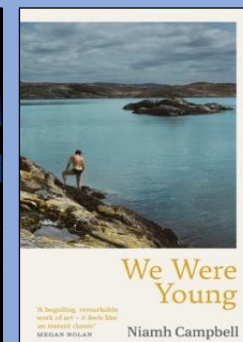
After She Left – Claire Amarti

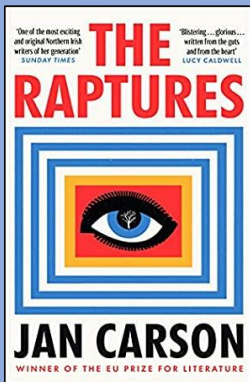
Remember My Name – Sam Blake

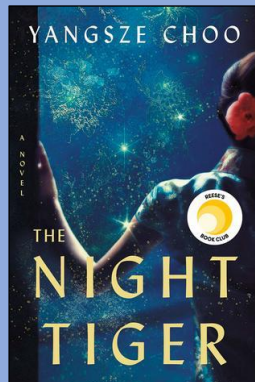
We Were Young – Niamh Campbell

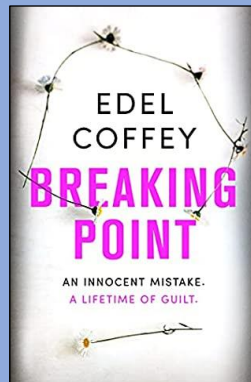
The Raptures – Jan Carson

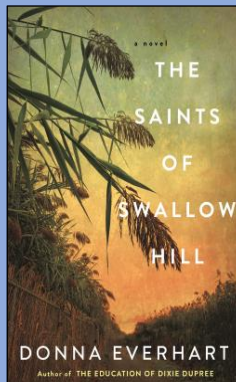
The Night Tiger – Yangsze Choo

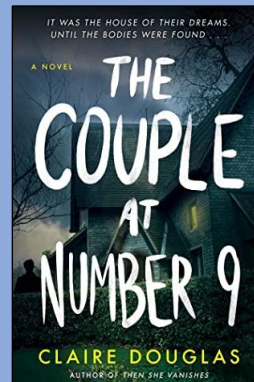
Breaking Point – Edel Coffey

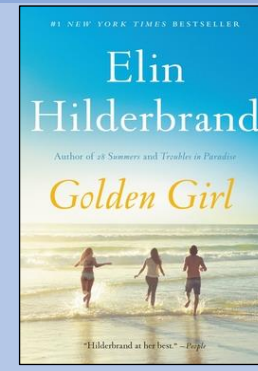
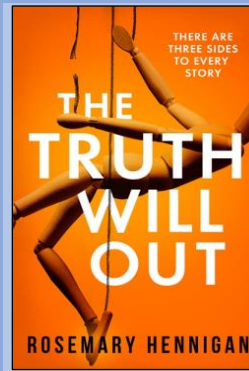
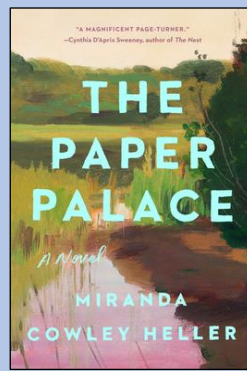
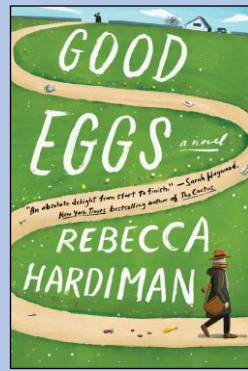
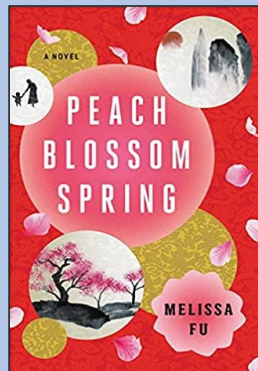
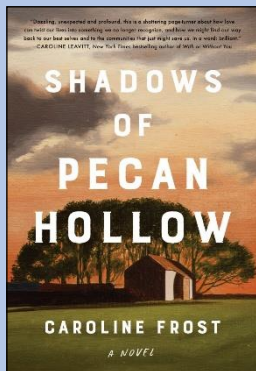
Greenwich Park – Katherine Faulkner

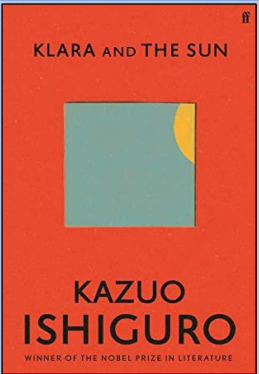

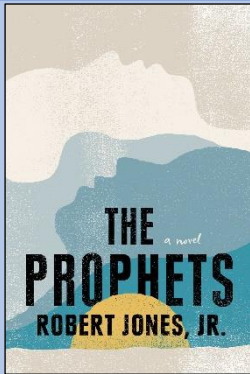
Golden Girl – Elin Hilderbrand

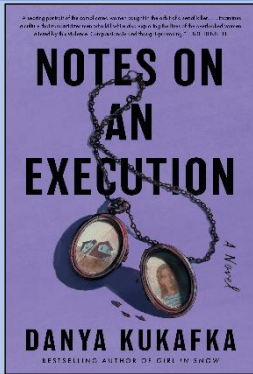
Klara and the Sun – Kazuo Ishiguro

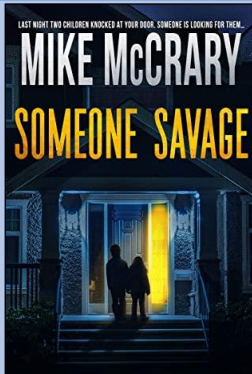
The Prophets – Robert Jones Junior

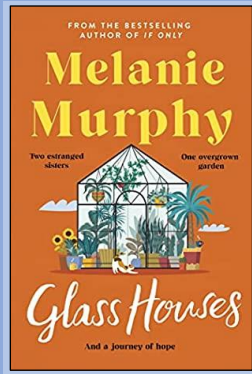
Notes on an Execution – Danya Kukafka

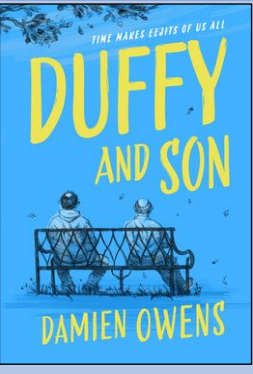
Glass Houses – Melanie Murphy

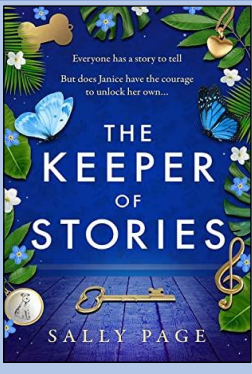
Open Water – Nelson Caleb Azumah

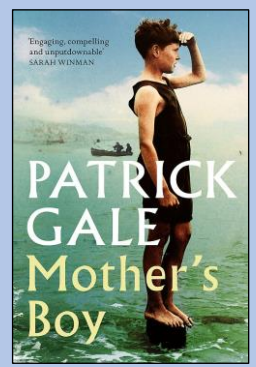
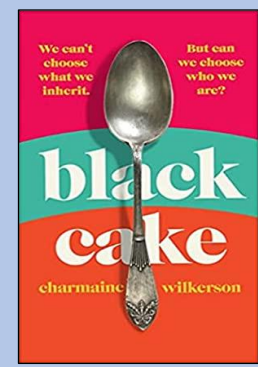
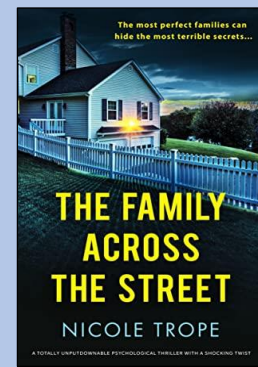
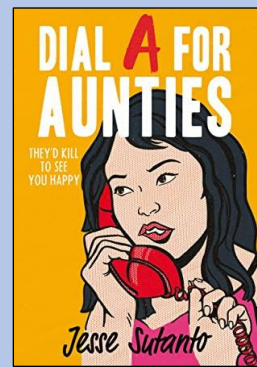
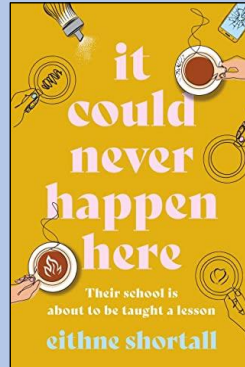
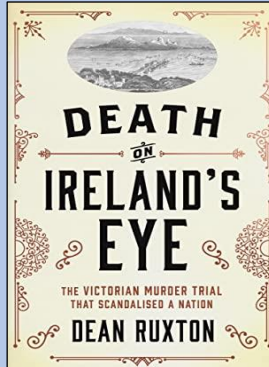
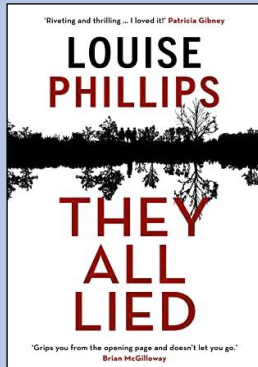
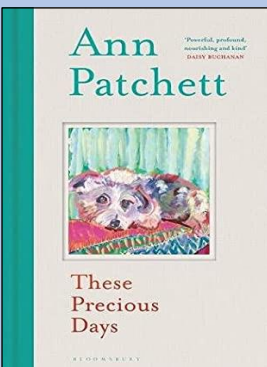
Duffy and Son – Damien Owens
