Ben is about to discover that in Haddley no one is as they seem. Everyone has something to hide.


We All Want Impossible Things – Catherine Newman




























A Hard Place – Patrick Kelly



Weyward – Emilia Hart



Let Them Lie – Gillian Florence







Flawed, complicated, secretive, bighearted, you'll fall in love with the Garnett girls, where questions are asked whether children can ever be free of the mistakes their parents make.






















The Island of Longing -**Anne Griffin**
