## **Get Cavan reading for Ireland Reads**

Ireland Reads is a campaign to get the whole country reading this month in the lead up to a national day of reading on Friday February 25th.

Cavan libraries have teamed up with libraries nationwide, publishers, booksellers, authors and others for the campaign, which is a Healthy Ireland at Your Library initiative and aims to celebrate reading and all the benefits it can have for wellbeing and enjoyment.

You can get involved by pledging to 'squeeze in a read' on Ireland Reads Day, Friday, February 25th.

Go to **www.irelandreads.ie** to pledge reading time, sign up for reading reminders and see how much time has been pledged by the Irish public so far.

Not sure what to read? No problem!

The Ireland Reads website also offers book recommendations suited to your interests and the time you have available.

There are more than 1,500 recommendations from librarians all around the country. Simply enter your favourite type of book and how long you would like to read each day and the website will offer a suitable book suggestion and work out how long it will take to complete – so you can set yourself a reading challenge if you want - a couch to 5k for books!

Library members can borrow from 12 million items or use online services to download eBooks, audiobooks, newspapers or magazines – there are thousands to choose from. Library membership is free and there are no fees to borrow.

Library staff in Cavan is delighted to welcome visitors back to our library spaces again and there are a number of children's events planned for the day



# **Annual Bishop Mac Kiernan** Memorial Lecture.



This year, in collaboration with Cumann Seanchais Bhreifne, Monsignor Liam Kelly will give his lecture 'A Bishop For The Shortest Time: Bernard Finegan (1837-1887)'.

The event is online on Tuesday 8th Feb at 7.30pm and will be available to view later at www.cavanlibrarv.ie.

The event also marks the launch of the Bishop MacKiernan Collection which was donated to Cavan Library Service in 2007. This remarkable collection 1.179 items includes 49 journals, 434 religious books, 520 Irish and general history books, 176 local studies items. Monsignor Kelly will conclude his talk with a short overview and insight into the collection.
