Cavan Monaghan Science Festival was delighted to work with the Family Resource Centres in Cavan/ Monaghan during science week 2020 to make available science kits for children. This in turn will expose participating families to STEM (science, technology, engineering, maths) in a way that is user friendly and fun!

Introducing TTRS

Cavan County Library Service is delighted to now offer **FREE** access to **TTRS** (Touch Type Read Spell)



This is a wonderful literacy programme that has helped many children and adults in Ireland improve their reading and spelling and to learn touch-typing. It is specifically designed for those with learning differences such as Dyslexia and Dyspraxia but may be used by all.

The student will learn a vocabulary of 4,000 words through typing, seeing the words and sentences on screen and hearing them on headphones.

TTRS is an **online programme and** students may progress at home or in a school environment at their own pace.
